1. Forewords

These Competition Rules " Precision Shooting for World and Continental Championship " first within the disciplines of the sporting context that use simple spherical tools that look at the global approach, through the simplification of the rules, in such a way as to be able to make it usable in any context.

This document has been drawn up in such a way that it can be made compatible by International / National Federations and LOC (Local Organizing Committee) with the UNESCO principles identified within the document "2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development" and assessed both its adherence and the results obtained.

2. Rules, Terminology & Definitions

This document aims to provide a uniquely structured and harmonized reference within the full Sports Bowls contest in terms of the game's rules and definitions for the " Raffa-Volo Precision Shooting ".

Updating made also be necessary by the evolution of the game both at a competitive level and as a sport for all in different geographical and cultural areas as well as an educational and rehabilitative tools, where:

Athlete: is a male or female person who has been registered for this championship by his or her national federation

Lane Manager: is a person who holds the Referee License. He/She acts as the supervisor of this match. He/She fills in the official result sheet and confirms the validity of this document with his signature and that of the referee and the linesman.

Referee: is a person who holds the Referee License. He/She is in charge of the training and the match together with the linesman and is responsible for the correct shots on the targets of the athletes.

Linesman: is a person who holds the Referee License. He/She is in charge of the training and the match together with the referee and is responsible for crossing the line.

Assistant: is any person who is used as a helper without a referee license. He/She follows the instructions of the Referee or the Linesman without decision-making authority.

Rules, Terminology & Definitions take into account also the different requirements in force, including the ones related to LOC (Local Organizing Committee) and Personnel acting as Officer, Volunteer or LOC Paid staff involved in activities regulated by CBI.

The complete terminology and reference documents is listed within the CBI Technical Rules of the Game, the document that is kept constantly updated in line with the progress of the sport of Bowls, applicable legislation, international sport rules, and CBI strategic issues.

3. The Game's playing area

As defined by the CBI technical Rules of the Game the playing area and surface is any raffa surface suitable for use in CBI competitions according to the CBI Technical Rules of the Game in force at the date of the event.

The target set (the Target Kit) is placed on the lane according to the Precision Shooting Rules.

Under no circumstances may these materials disclose from local safety Rules and/or constitute a danger to the players' and/or referees' health;

People, fixtures, objects, or any other thing (posts, lamps, metal wires, branches, ceilings, walls, protection nets, etc.) to be found either upon the siding planks or outside of them, including the retaining walls supporting the latter, are considered as foreign to the game and thus irrelevant to the game regularity.

4. Bowls & Targets

The Bowls

All bowls from each athlete and from the target set must conform in material, colour, diameter and weight to the Technical Rules of the Game, in force at the date of the event.

Athletes can use their set of bowls both for training and/or competition as long as these fulfill the regulations. The championship referee is in charge to check and approve the use personal bowls. In case of rejection each athlete should use the bowls, of the same color, made available, free of charge, by the LOC (Local Organizing Committee).

Diameter between 106 and 107 mm with a tolerance of +/- 0.5 mm
Weight between 900 and 920 gr. With a tolerance of +/- 5 gr.

The Targets (Kit)

The targets set is composed by one white "pallino" and one white bowl and 2 red obstacle bowls where the full set should comply with the CBI Technical Rules in force at the date of the event.

The target set also include a carpet with 8 accessories for the positioning of the pallino and bowls.

The carpet has a size of 100 x 64,5 cm with a thickness of 4 mm, built in reinforced PVC consisting of several indelaminable layers with a special fiberglass inside.

Official CBI Target carpets are registered and identified by the manufacturer through the assigned number from Inspection/Certification body.

5. The Game

This sport discipline is played on lanes by male and female athletes where their ultimate goal is to score the highest number of points.

5.1 Rules

In each championship, the athletes will take part in two qualifying rounds.

The shooting order for the 1st round will be determined by drawing lots and for the 2nd round the athletes will start in random order.

Example

In the 1st round Group 1 is composed of the athletes:

A + B + C + D and starts with A

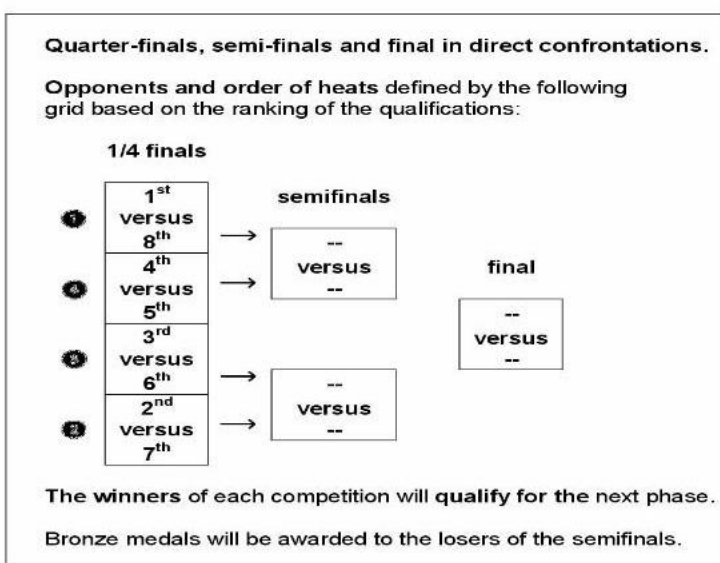
In the 2nd round Group 1 will be composed of:

D + C + B + A and starts with D

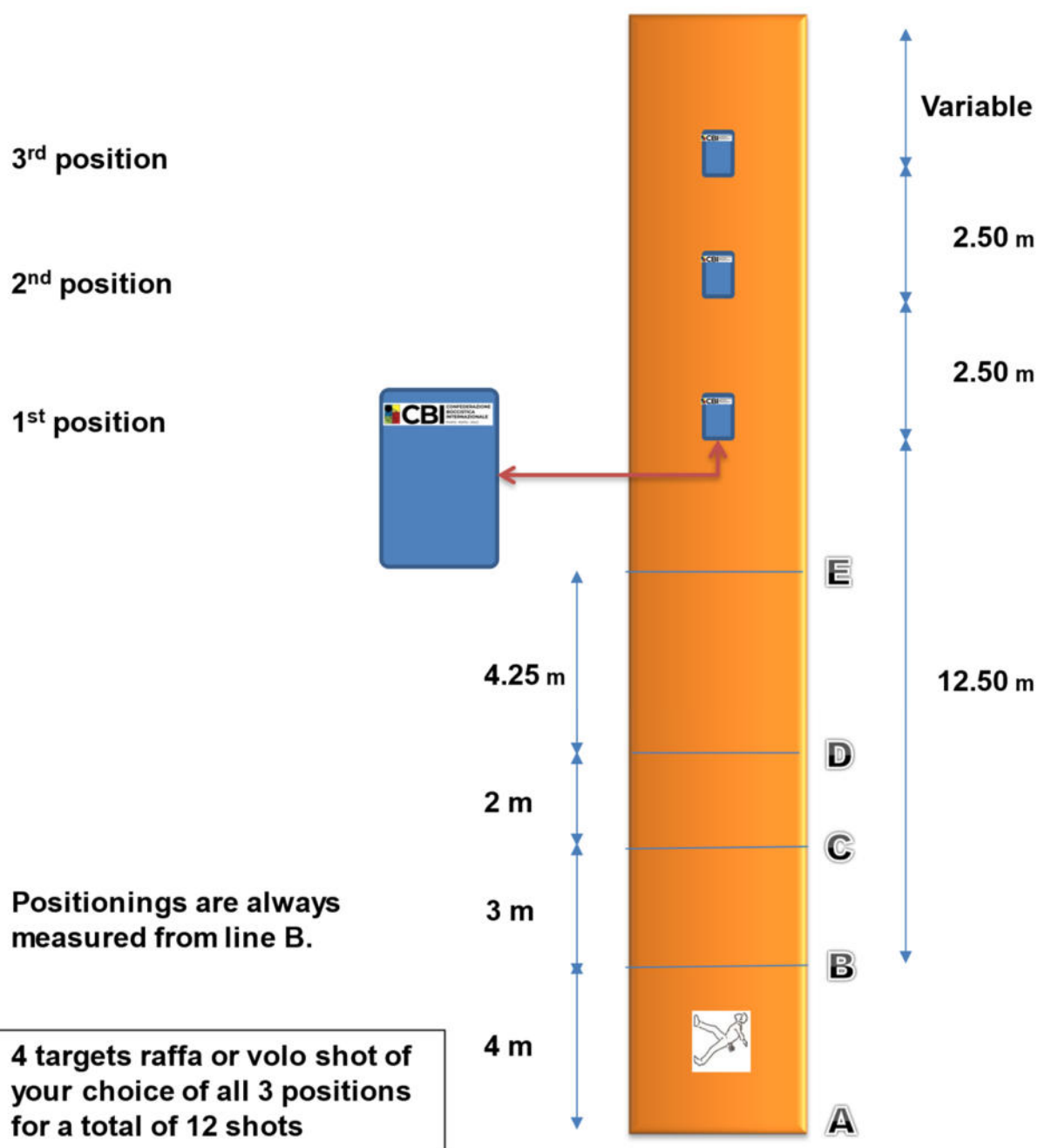
The results of the two heats will be added together for qualification.

The nations with the 8 best totals will qualify for the quarter finals.

In case of a tie, the best performance in a round will be taken into account and, in case of a further tie, the athletes concerned will play a 3rd round immediately after the last round (respecting, if necessary, the prescribed recovery time)

5.2 Training (Warm Up)

The training session is conducted by the supervising referee only, without referees and linesmen.

It is recommended to use at least 2 (better 4) lanes side by side.

During the warm-up, the designated athlete and his/her team have 5 minutes to practice.

Each athlete may take as many shots as he wishes anywhere on the field until the end of the period.

The supervising referee will announce the start of the warm-up and, after 5 minutes, will declare the end of the warm-up.

The competition will start when all athletes have finished their warm-up.

5.3 The Game

After the warm-up (training), the lane manager presents the 1st athlete of lane 1 and mentions how many points that target is worth.

The athlete announces to the referee whether he is shooting in raffer or volo. After the referee has given the go-ahead with a whistle the shot must be executed within 30 seconds.

The linesman takes up a position at the reference line (B or C) and signals an invalid shot by raising an arm.

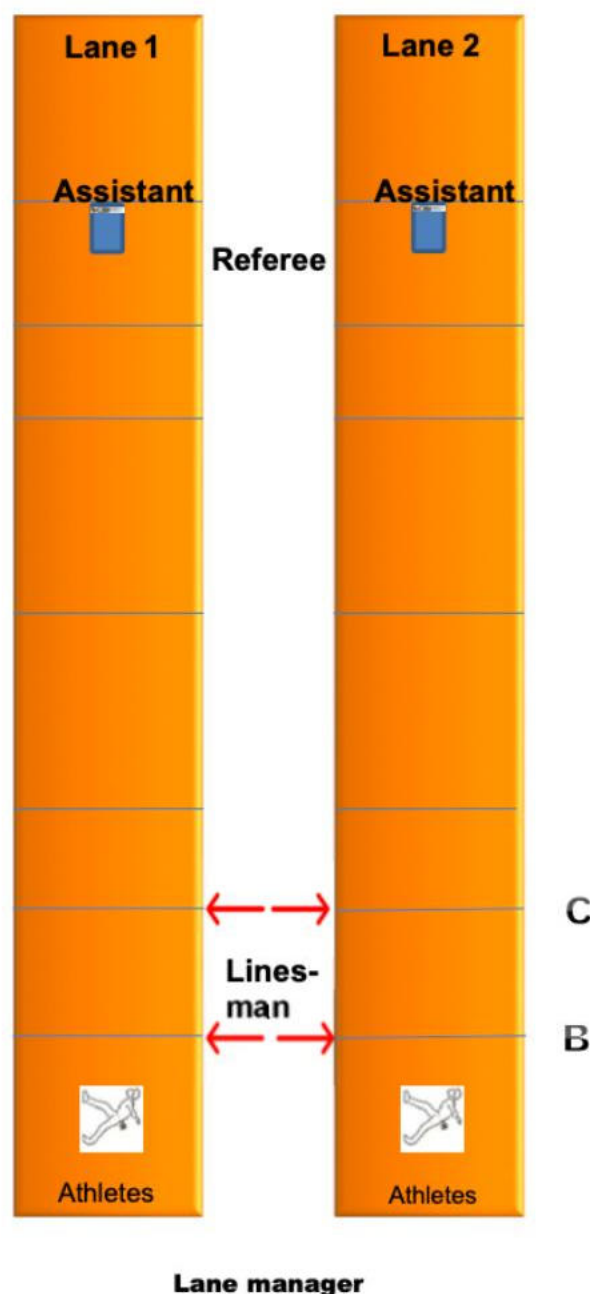
The referee stands at the height of the target and also signals an invalid shot by raising an arm. Immediately after the 1st shot, the lane manager presents the 1st athlete of lane 2 in the same way. The linesman and the referee follow the shot on the other lane in the same way.

Only after the 2nd athlete's shot, shifted objects are returned to their original position. During this time, the 2nd athlete on lane 1 prepares to shoot. After the 4th shot of the athlete on lane 2, the carpets are moved to the 2nd position and after the 2nd series of shots to the 3rd position.

The number of points indicated in the table corresponds to each target that has been hit correctly.

The shot is valid when correctly hit object leaves the place it occupied on the carpet. In addition, for other targets, the "obstacle" object must not move permanently from its marks or holes.

The targets and/or obstacles are positioned only by the referee



6. Scoreboard & Records

The number of points reported in the table corresponds to each target that has been hit correctly.

The shot is valid when correctly hit object leaves the place it occupied on the carpet. In addition, for other targets, the "obstacle" object must not move permanently from its marks or holes.

The targets and/or obstacles are positioned only by the referee.

Docs for Int'l Records confirmation will be available from Referee. In case the athlete is selected for antidoping control, conformation will be issued only upon the negative lab report.

If an athlete hits all 12 targets correctly - 40 points out of 40 - he continues the test series starting from target 1 on position 1 and stops it at the first mistake.
